Project specifications:

Construction of this new school was done by conventional building design using a steel frame. The structure is of brick and block construction with insulated cavity, that's gives a highly energy efficient building. The mono pitch, lean to roofs, are of a truss construction and are covered with concrete interlocking tiles. On the floors, insulation is covered with reinforced sand and cement screed and then with either carpet or vinyl. Ceilings are either plasterboard and skim or a suspended grid with inset tiles. The building is protected by advanced security and fire alarm systems. It was vitally important that the project finished on time, to ensure that the academic year was not disrupted.
